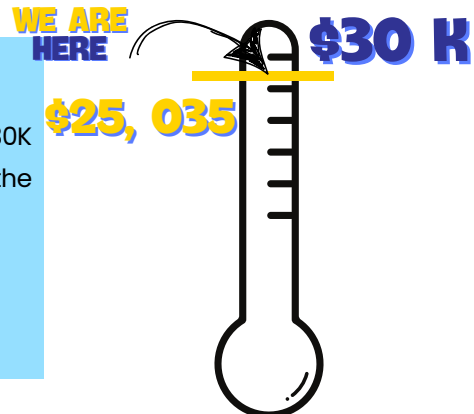
Bulldog Fund Goal
